The focus of our ongoing efforts continues to be to prepare students to become productive, responsible citizens ready to meet the challenges of a changing and exciting future. Our goal is to have children leave here each day happy and proud of their daily accomplishments, knowing that they have done their personal best!

In addition to our K-5 program, Fulton Elementary is also home to a regional Special Education program for students with emotional disabilities and a Regional Early Childhood Center (RECC) for pre-school special education students. We believe that all students are entitled to every facet of the educational process and to the mutual self-respect that comes from successful interaction in a school with high expectations. Our entire staff feels accountable for the learning of ALL children, including those with special needs. We are also proud to be in our third year of the inclusion model with the Cedar Lane School which was relocated to our campus. All of our third grade students participate in an inclusion music or art class at Cedar Lane during the school year. This class is co-taught by related arts staff from both schools. In addition, many students from Cedar Lane are included in classes that take place at Fulton Elementary throughout the school year. Communication and collaboration among staff, pupils, families, and community empower ALL of our students to reach their fullest potential. In a growing community, we strive to provide that personal touch that comes from the meaningful involvement of the entire school community.

We are pleased that Fulton's second addition is complete. We opened our doors in August 2006 to a brand new kindergarten wing. Students and staff have adjusted well to the new full-day schedule. The children feel special about eating lunch in the cafeteria and appreciate our brand new playground equipment and blacktop that is reserved just for our smaller friends.

We operate our school to support greatness, build courage and encourage independence in our students. We believe that each child is a unique and unrepeated miracle. We look forward to meeting families new to our community.

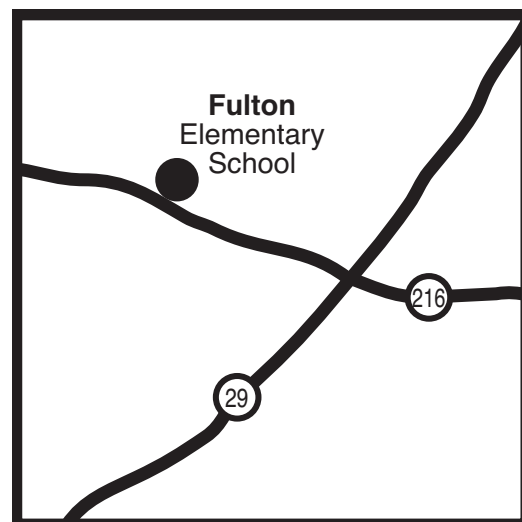

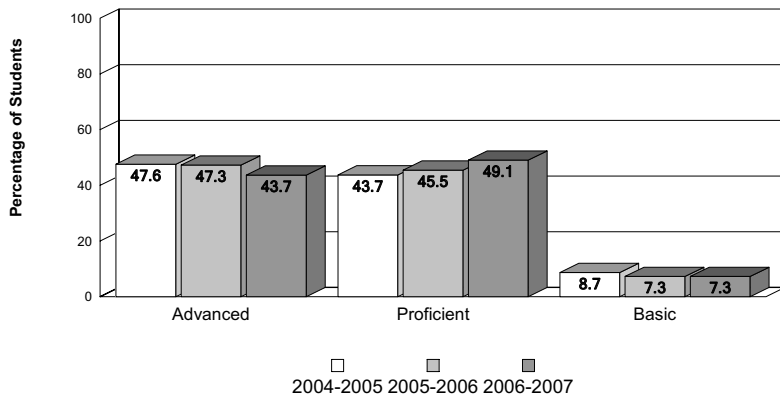

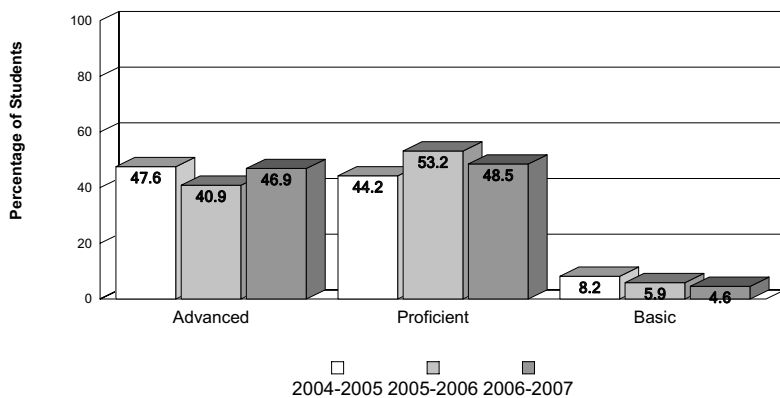
